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FOREWORD

The Society of Mayflower Descendants in the State of California was organised January 11, 1908. In the following pages, it presents the pedigrees of the first one hundred members admitted, together with their supplemental lines. The first thirty-three names are those of the charter members. If this volume meets with a cordial reception, the second and third volumes will be compiled as soon as practicable, each containing the pedigrees of one hundred additional members.

The opening of the Willamette Valley to settlement, and the discovery of gold in California in 1849, aroused the adventurous spirit of the descendants of the Pilgrims; and they formed an important element in the first emigrant trains across the plains, and the passenger lists of the ships and steamers which sailed for San Francisco Bay. The early settlement of new territory is often shrouded in mystery, for the demands upon pioneers leave no leisure for the making of records. Hence, this Society has endeavored to preserve in this volume some account of those of the old stock who settled the newer States—whence they came, how and when.

The Appendix contains copies of records not previously printed; and it is hoped that the second volume will comprise a still larger proportion of such material. The Index includes all the names in the pedigrees and the Appendix, constituting a finding list of Mayflower ancestry which is unusually comprehensive.

Such a publication as this cannot be in general demand; but it is hoped that the support given it may justify the Society in authorising additional research, to the end that records still existing may be traced and printed before they shall be lost irrevocably.

The Marriage Certificate of Enoch' Coleman of Nantucket, Massachusetts

The records quoted in this, and the succeeding, article were filed in connection with the applications of Herbert Folger and Clinton Folger, California Nos. 1 and 18 (see pages 7 and 34):

Enoch Coleman (Sarah Pratt, Joseph, Mary Priest, Degory) was born at Nantucket, Massachusetts, 24 March, 1724-5, and was married at a meeting of the Nantucket Society of Friends (Quakers) 5 January, 1748. The following is a copy of the marriage certificate (Nantucket Friends Records, Book 1, page 158):

"Whereas Enoch Coleman, Son of Jeremiah Coleman, late of Sherborn, on the Island of Nantucket, in the Province of the Massachusetts Bay, New England, Deceased, & Sarah, his wife; and Mary Myrick, Daughter of Andrew Myrick, of Sherborn on Nantucket aforesaid, & Jedidah, his Wife, Having Declared their Intentions of Taking each other in marriage before Several Publick meetings of the People called Quakers, in Sherborn aforesaid, according to the good order used among them; and proceeding therein after deliberate considerations thereof (with Regard unto the Righteous Law of God in that Case); They also appearing Clear of all others & having Consent of Parents and others concerned; were allowed by said meetings.

"Now these are to Certify to all whom it may concern, That for the full Accomplishing of their said Intentions, this fifth Day

of the Eleventh month, called January in the year according to the Christian Account. One thousand seven hundred and fortyeight, they, the said Enoch Coleman and Mary Myrick appeared in a Publick Assembly of the aforesaid People and others, met together at their Publick Meeting House in Sherborn on Nantucket aforesaid, and in a Solemn manner he, the said Enoch Coleman, taking the said Mary Myrick by the Hand, did openly declare as followeth: Friends, I desire you to be my Witnesses that I take this my Friend, Mary Myrick to be my Wife, promising by the Lord's Assistance to be unto her a true & Loving Husband until it shall please God by Death to Separate us. And then and there in the said Assembly, the said Mary Myrick did in like manner Declare as followeth: Friends, I desire you to be my Witnesses that I take this my Friend, Enoch Coleman, to be my husband, promising by the Lord's Assistance to be unto him a true & loving Wife, until it shall please God by Death to Separate us. And, as a further Confirmation thereof the said Enoch Coleman and Mary Coleman did then & there to these Presents Set their hands; She according to the custom of marriage assuming the name of her Husband.

The Will of Charles Folger of Nantucket, Massachusetts

Lydia Coleman (Enoch, Sarah Pratt, Joseph, Mary Priest, Degory), born at Nantucket, Massachusetts, 4 December, 1757, was married there, 19 July, 1778, to Charles Folger, who was born at Nantucket, 26 December, 1758, and died there, 4 September, 1818 A literal copy of his will follows:

"I, Charles Folger of Nantucket in the County of Nantucket and Commonwealth of Massachusetts Esquire being poorly as to bodily health, but sound in mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this life, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manna and form following:

"Firstly; I will that all the just debts which I may owe to any person or persons, at the time of my decease shall be paid and discharged by my executors hereafter named within a convenient

time after my decease.

"Secondly: I give unto my beloved wife Lydia Folger the use and income of all my estate, both real and personal of every kind and nature, during her remaining my widow, with the privilege to her of selling all or any part of said estate as she may need according to her discretion.

"Thirdly: I give to and amongst all my children, namely, Charles Folger, Frederick Folger, Hiram Folger, John Folger, William Folger, Lydia Bunker widow of Thaddeus, Peleg Folger, Elizabeth Coffin widow of Edward, Alfred Folger, Lucretia Folger, Mark Folger and Edward Folger, all the remainder of my estate both real and personal (not before disposed of to my wife as afore-

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said) to be equally divided amongst them my said children, part and part alike, to them and to their several heirs, in the manner as is above set forth and to their assigns forever.

"And lastly I do hereby appoint, constitute and make my beloved wife Lydia Folger and my sons Charles Folger, Hiram Folger, William Folger and John Folger joint executors to this my last will and testament.

"In witness whereof, I the said Charles Folger have hereunto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.

The following interesting will is printed at the request of the testator's descendant, Emily Foster (Talbot) Walker (William Chaloner Talbot, Elisa Chaloner, William, Walter, Ninyon), Mrs. Cyrus Walker, California No. 5:

"In the name of God, Amen. I, Ninyon Chaloner of Newport in ye County of Newport and Colony of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations in New England Tallow Chandler being in good and perfect health, mind and understanding do make this my last will and Testament in manner following.

First, I commit my soul to God that gave it and my body to

ye earth.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife, Ann Chaloner, ye sum of eight hundred pounds in good and passable publick bills of credit of ye colony aforesaid, ye best bedd and furniture in my now dwelling house, my best great looking glass to be at her own choice, three pewter dishes, twelve pewter plates, nine flagg chairs of a brown collour that are in ye chamber of my now dwelling house, one table of her own choice, the cupboard that now stands in my bed room, two silver porringers, two silver spoons, the best iron pot and bell mettle skillet to be and remain to her own proper use and behoof forever and also ye use and service of my negroe man named Charles for and during ye term of her natural life if she should so long happen to live.

Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Walter Chaloner ye sum of one thousand pounds—good and passable bills of public credit of ye colony—(having already advanced for and given him ye said Walter Chaloner a considerable sum) to be and

remain to his own proper use and behoof.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son John Chaloner ye sum of one thousand pounds in good and passable public bills of credit of said colony, and also my negro man named Charles after ye decease of my wife Ann Chaloner (if said negro

shall be then alive) having hereinbefore given ye use and service of him ye said Charles to my said wife—and during the term of her naturall life, and likewise a large silver Porringer that was left him by his late grandmother Cole to be and remain to his own proper use and behoof.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son William Chaloner ye sum of one thousand pounds in good and passable bills of public credit of said colony and my silver mugg and ye

same to be and remain to his own proper use and behoof.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Elizabeth Cahoone ye wife of James Cahoone of Newport aforesaid mariner ye sum of seven hundred pounds in good and passable bills of publick credit of ye colony aforesaid to be and remain to her own proper use and behoof.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my —Il beloved daughter May Robinson the wife of James Robinson of N (worn) -forsaid physician the sum of five hundred pounds in good and (worn) bills of publick credit of (worn) colony (having already advanced ye said Mary a considerable su (worn) proper use and behoof.

Item. I give and bequ (morn) daughter Sarah Chaloner the sum of eight (morn) and passable bills of publick (morn) ture, a large look glass, one large table, one iron pot, one bell mettle skillet all to be (morn) own choice (after my said wife Ann Chaloner hath made her choice of ye same nature) the chist of drawers, two silver porringers two silver (morn) three pewter dishes twelve pewter plates and six leather chairs to be and remain to her own proper use and behoof.

Item. My will is and I do hereby order and appoint that my said wife Ann Chaloner shall remain and be in possession of my now dwelling house work house land (worn) appurtenances thereunto belonging scituate lying and being in Newport aforesaid, being butted & bounded as followeth, east upon a street, south upon land belonging to Jonathan Clark, west and north upon streets, until my youngest child shall arrive to ye age of twenty one years if she shall happen so long to live and continue a widdow, and my will is that my clock silver Tankard my negro man called Frank and the utensils of the work house shall belong to and go along with my said dwelling house, but upon her decease or intermarriage which shall first happen before my youngest child shall arrive to ye age of twenty one years, the possessions of the said premises shall go to and be vested in my trustees hereinafter named and to be improved by the (worn) for ye benefit of my child (worn) under age, and my said trustees shall during their haveing possession as affores (worn) pay unto my said wife Ann

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Chaloner ye sum of fifteen pounds (worn) annum in good and passable bills of publick credit of said colony for and during ve term of her naturall life in lieu of her thirds or right of dower therein, and my will likewise is and I do hereby order and appoint that when my youngest child shall arrive to age, as aforesaid, then my said dwelling house work house with ye land and appurtenances thereunto belonging, the clock, Tankard and negro man Frank shall descend and go to my eldest son that shall be liveing at that time to be and remain to him his heirs and assigns, and to his and their own proper use and behoof forever, reserving thereunto that such son to whom ye same shall descend shall pay unto my wife Ann Chaloner the said sum of fifteen pounds per annum for and during ye term of her naturall life, and likewise if ye said premises shall descend to my said son Walter Chaloner that in twelve months thereafter he shall pay to each of his brothers one hundred pounds and to his sisters ye sum of fifty pounds each (that shall be surviving at his taking possession) in good and passable bills. If ye possession shall happen at that time to descend to my second son John Chaloner, then he shall within twelve months as aforesaid pay to his brother William Chaloner the sum of two hundred pounds and to each of his sisters fifty pounds (in the like bills of publick credit) that shall be surviving at ye time of taking possession as afore (worn) ut if ye same shall at ye time of my youngest child comeing to age as a (worn) end to my said son William Chaloner then he shall within (worn) as aforesaid pay unto each of his surviving sisters ye sum (worn) pounds in like bills of publick credit and the same to be and (worn) tive proper use and behoof.

And I do hereby order (worn) decease each of my said children shall (worn) Chaloner is in possession of the premises have ye use and benefit of a room in my said dwelling house as long as he or she shall remain in a single state.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my said wife, Ann Chaloner, and my said daughter Sarah Chaloner all my linnen (not hereinbefore given) to be equally divided between them and to be and remain to their respective proper use and behoof.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my beloved grandson James Cahoone son of ye said James Cahoone by my said daughter Elizabeth ye sum of one hundred pounds in good and passable bills of publick credit of said colony within twelve months after my decease, and to be improved by my executor hereinafter named for his use, and ye same to be paid him when he shall arrive to ye age of twenty one years and then to be and remain to his proper use and behoof.

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Item. I give and bequeath unto my beloved granddaughter Mary Robinson daughter of ye said James Robinson, by my said daughter Mary, the sum of one hundred pounds in good and passable bills of publick credit of said colony within twelve months after my decease and to be improved by my executor herein after named for her use and ye same to be paid her when she shall arrive of eighteen years of age or day of marriage which shall first happen and then to be and remain to her own proper use and behoof.

Item. I do hereby oder and appoint that my said wife Ann Chaloner during her widdowhood shall have ye use and services of my negro woman called Han (norn) unless my said wife shall think proper to sell her and if sold ye produce shall be equally divided between my said wife and surviving sons, and to remain to each of them respectively.

Item. I do hereby give and bequeath unto my three sons Walter John William all ye rest of my estate not herein before disposed of, of whatever nature or kind to be equally divided between them and to be and remain to their and each of their respective proper use and behoof.

My will is and I do likewise further order and appoint that such of my children as are of age at ye time of my decease, shall receive their bequ (morn) of my personall estate herein before given to them immediately thereafter. The part or portion of such of my children as shall be under age at ye time of my decease shall be improved by my executors for ye benefit of each of them respectively and to be paid to each of them as they shall attain (if a son) to ye age of twenty one years (and if a daughter) to ye age of eighteen years or day of marriage which shall first happen and that if either of my said children (morn) to die before his her or their receiving such part or portion of my personall estate as aforesaid, ye said shall be equally divided between all my children that shall then be surviving and to be and remain to her or their respective use and behoof.

Lastly. I do make and ordain my said wife Ann Chaloner my said son Walter Chaloner and Daniel Gould of Newport aforesaid Esq. executrix and executors of this my last will and testament for ye interests and purposes herein contained. And I do make and appoint Joseph Wright, shopkeeper and James Martin both of Newport aforesaid overseers of this (morn) ll to T (morn) same performed according to my true inte (morn). I give to each of them a mourning ring. (morn) Ninyon Chaloner have to this (morn) twenty fifth day of March in the sixteenth year

of his Majesty's Reign George ye Second King of Great Britain and (worn) Annoque Domini 1748

Calvin Jabes Mills, of the town and vilage of Sidney, N. Y. being duly sworn, says:

I am the only surviving son of Calvin Mills, late of Guilford, N. Y. (son of Samuel Mills and Luey Coy Mills) who was born at Norfolk, Conn. july 17th, 1793, and died at Alden, N. Y., March 17, 1850 and of his wife Sophia Roxanna Rogers, who was born at Granville, Mass. Mar. 27, 1791 & died in Buffalo, N. Y. March 9, 1852 I was born at Guilford, N. Y. Oct. 5, 1824 My mother, Sophia Roxanna (Rogers) Mills, was the daughter of Samuel Rogers, who was born January 30, 1764, at North Bolton, Conn. & died in the town of Unadilla, N. Y., a mile north of this village, on the twelfth day of March, 1829 He married at East Windsor,

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Conn., Nov. 24, 1785 Sarah Skinner, who was born Dec. 7, 1766, and died at the home of my mother, in Alden, N. Y., Oct. 2, 1850

My knowledge of these matters is derived thus: Born and reared till my 18th year some seven miles from the home of my grandparents, Samuel and Sarah (Skinner) Rogers, I remember grandfather's death in 1829 Thereafter grandmother made her home alternately with my mother, in Guilford, and my uncle Charles Skinner Rogers, in Sidney. From 1841 to 1851 my home was that of my uncle, Henry W. Rogers, in Buffalo, N. Y. His family bible, now owned by his nephew, Henry W. Rogers of Chicago, Ill., had a full family record, going back to Thomas Rogers, 18th signer of the Mayflower Contract, who died in the 1st winter, at Plymouth, Mass. In 1845, my father's family removed to Alden, N. Y., 20 miles east of Buffalo, and grandmother's home was thereafter with mother, while she made long visits in the home of my uncle in Buffalo which was also my home. She often recited in my hearing events in the family history in Connecticut, Massachusetts and New York States. She said she and her husband Samuel Rogers "were reckoned the handsomest couple who came into Wapping (now East Windsor) meeting house.

I further certify that my sister, Sarah Sophia Mills, was born in Guilford, N. Y., Dec. 1, 1837; that she married Aug. 20, 1856 in Buffalo, N. Y., Rev. Samuel Rankin Gayley, born Oct. 18, 1826 and that Charles Mills Gayley, Professor of English, University of California, Berkeley, California, is their son.

1. I also testify that my record of my father's family notes these facts: Samuel John Mills, born Jan'y 27, 1816, married Feb. 15, 1839 Emily Sexton. Their daughter Helen Sophia, born Guilford, Nov. 5, 1840, died single, at Sidney, Feb. 20, 1907 Samuel died in Buffalo, Sep. 24, 1858—his wife Emily died in Unadilla, N. Y., Jan'y 24, 1896

2. Calvin Jabes Mills, born Oct. 5, 1824, married Aug. 19, 1851 at Cincinnati, Ohio, Harriet S. Almy, who died, childless, April 20, 1895, at Brooklyn, N. Y.

3. Lucy Emeline Mills, born Mar. 13, 1827, married in Shanghae, China, Rev. Justus Doolittle of the American Board Mission, June 11, 1859, and died at Rutland, N. Y., Aug. 12, 1865, leaving no living child.

4. Rev. Charles Rogers Mills, D. D., born Aug. 21, 1829, was graduated at Lafayette College, Easton, Pa., July 27, 1858, licensed to preach by the Presbytery of Newcastle, Delaware, April 1, 1855; graduated at Princeton Seminary, New Jersey, May 6, 1856; ordained by the Presbytery of Buffalo, N. Y.,

June 25, 1856, and received the degree of Doctor of Divinity from Lafayette College in 1883 He married in Buffalo, N. Y., Aug. 20, 1856, Rose Anna McMaster, and they went soon after to China with his sisters Lucy and Sarah, and Sarah's husband, missionaries of the Presbyterian Board. With his brother-in-law, S. R. Gayley, in 1861, he established the Northern China Mission, at Teng Chow. There Mr. Gayley died in 1862, and Charles in 1895 Rose (McMaster) Mills died at Teng Chow, Feb. 3, 1874 Charles married at Chefoo, China, Nov. 26, 1884, Annetta Eugenia Thompson, who was born in Western New York, July 20, 1853 The children of Charles are: Calvin Henry, born Sep. 21, 1867; Charles Gayley Mills, born Feb. 17, 1869; Edward McMaster Mills, Sep. 6, 1870; Rose Edith Mills, June 5th, 1872; Samuel John Mills, Nov. 24, 1886; and Roger Sherman Mills, June 14, 1889

5. Henry Rogers Mills, born Sep. 9th, 1833, married in 1869 at Iola, Kansas, Matilda Saxton, who died in 1870 He died

at Binghamton, N. Y., Dec. 8, 1885, leaving no child.

6. Sarah Sophia Mills, born Guilford, N. Y., Dec. 1, 1837, married Aug. 20, 1856, at Buffalo, N. Y., Rev. Samuel Rankin Gayley, who was born Oct. 18, 1826 After the death of her husband at Teng Chow, China, July 29, 1862, she started, with her four year old boy, Charles Mills Gayley, to return to America, via Ireland, where she went to visit Mr. Gayley's family; and she married Aug. 24, 1863, Rev. Andrew Browne, (cousin of Mr. Gayley) pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Hollymount. County Mayo, where she resided till 1887, when the family came to America, settling at Iron Mountain, Michigan, where Mr. Browne died May 14, 1888 Her three eldest sons had come to the United States earlier. Her Browne children were: David Henry, born Hollymount, Ireland, June 8, 1864; Andrew Allan, Oct. 7, 1867; Samuel Rogers, Sep. 19, 1871, died Mar. 1, 1888; Sara Spencer, May 16, 1873; John Calvin, July 19, 1877 Sarah S. (Mills) Browne died at Ann Arbor, Mich., Nov. 13, 1894 She is buried at Ann Arbor, with Mr. Browne and their son Samuel Rogers Browne.

Now these are to certify all whom it may concern that for the full accomplishment of their said intentions this Twenty Eighth day of the Tenth Month in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred & Eighty Four they the said Obed Mitchell & Lydia Gardner appeared in a publick assembly of the aforesaid people & others at their publick Meeting House in Sherborn aforesaid; And then & there in a Solemn manner the said Obed Mitchell taking the said Lydia Gardner by the hand did openly declare as followeth. Friends I desire you to be my Witnesses that I take this my friend Lydia Gardner to be my Wife, promising by the Lords Assistance to be unto her a true & Loving husband until death separate us. And then & there in the said assembly the said Lydia Gardner did in like manner declare as followeth. The Marriage Certificate of James' Mitchell of Nantucket, Mass.

James Mitchell (Obed , Rachel Hussey, Sarah Gorham, Stephen', John', Desire' Howland, John') was born at Nantucket, Massachusetts, 20 November, 1798, and was married there, 2 November, 1820, to Lydia Green Clasby, who died at San Francisco, California, 12 October, 1886 The marriage certificate is recorded in Nantucket Friends' Records, Book 3, page 9 A literal copy follows:

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Whereas, James Mitchel of Nantucket in the commonwealth of Massachusetts, Son of Obed and Lydia Mitchel of Nantucket in the commonwealth aforesaid, and Lydia G. Clasby daughter of John and Sarah Clasby (the former deceased) of Nantucket aforesaid, having declared their intentions of taking each other in marriage, before the Nantucket monthly meeting of the people called Quakers, according to the order established in said society; after due enquiry and deliberate consideration thereof, they appearing clear of all others and having consent of parents, their proceedings were allowed by the said meeting.

Now these are to certify to all whom it may concern that for the full accomplishing of their said intentions this second day of the eleventh month, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty, they the said James Mitchel and Lydia G Clasby appeared at a public assembly of the aforesaid people and others, in their meeting house in Nantucket aforesaid; and he the said James Mitchel taking the said Lydia G Clasby by the hand did openly declare as followeth: "Friends I take this my friend Lydia G Clasby to be my wife promising through Divine assistance to be unto her a faithful and affectionate husband until death separate us" And the said Lydia G Clasby did then and there in like manner declare "Friends I take this my friend James Mitchel to be my husband, promising through Divine assistance to be unto him a faithful and affectionate wife until death separate us" or words of the like import. And as a further confirmation thereof they the said James Mitchel and Lydia G Clasby have hereunto set their hands, She after the custom of marriage adopting the name of her husband.

Affidavit of Isaac Richardson' Wilbur, San Francisco

The following affidavit was filed in support of the application of Miss Elizabeth Agnes¹⁰ Wilbur (Isaac Richardson², Sophia² Etheridge, Content Leeds¹ Champlin, William², Joseph³, Elizabeth⁴ Denison, Mercy² Gorham, Desire² Howland, John³):

Isaac Richardson Wilbur, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

I was born in New Baltimore, Green County, New York, on October 28th, 1835, and am the son of Allen Russell Wilbur, who was born at Chenango County, New York, on October 4, 1806 and died at Mattoon, Illinois, on July 11, 1881, and of his wife, Sophia' Etheridge, who was born in Sheldon, Vermont, about 1809, and died in Bristol, Kenosha County, Wisconsin, in 1839, about October. The said Sophia Etheridge was married at New Baltimore, about 1827 or 1828, and was the daughter of Nathaniel Etheridge, who was born at Boston about 1773, and died at Sackett's Harbor, in the war of 1812, and of Content Leeds Champlin, who was born at Quechee, Vermont, on Sept. 2, 1790 and died at Kenosha, Wisconsin, about 1871, married about 1805

I was married at Stockton, California, on August 23, 1865, to Louise Visher, who was born at Fulton, New York, on March 18, 1847, and died at San Francisco on March 5, 1903 Onr children were the following:

- Caroline Luana³⁰ Wilbur, born June 19, 1866, near Stockton, married November 14, 1888, to John Strait Wilbur, the adopted son of William Wilbur, of Hamilton, Illinois.
- Harold Russell^a Wilbur, born at Stockton, June 7, 1876, married January 7, 1902, to Ila L. Henderson.
- Elizabeth Agnes¹⁰ Wilbur, born at Stockton, on December 3, 1872, unmarried.

My knowledge of these facts, as to my ancestors, was derived from personal acquaintance with my grandmother, Content Leeds (Champlin) Etheridge, who removed from Vermont to Wisconsin about 1849; and from 1855 to 1860 I saw much of her, and cor-

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responded with her up to the time of her death, after I came to California, where I arrived on the 28th day of April, 1860

The children of Nathaniel and Content Leeds' (Champlin) Etheridge were the following:

- Sophia Etheridge, born in 1809, married Allen Russell Wilbur, and had: (1) Frances Wilbur, born January, 1830, married, about 1855, to William Kemp, of Chicago, and had five children: Ida Kemp, married Emery; Henry Etheridge Kemp; Laura Kemp, married William Hamman; Julia Kemp, married Walter; and Grace Kemp, married E. Leonard.
- 4. William Etheridge, died unmarried, at about the age of nineteen or twenty.

Mary' Champlin, daughter of Capt. William' and Content (Brown) Champlin, born about 1797, and died about 1895, in Bristol, Wisconsin, married Hastings Castle, and had:

- William Castle, who died in 1907, in Pleasant Prairie, Wisconsin, married — Corcoran, and had two children.
- Mary Castle, who married Gibbs, a widower, but had no children of her own.

Friends I Desire you to be my Witnesses that I take this my Friend Judith Starbuck to be my Wife, promising by the Lords Assistance to be unto her a True & Loving Husband until it shall please God by Death to Separate us. And then and there in the said Assembly the said Judith Starbuck did in like manner declare as folloeth. Friends I

Desire you to be my Witnesses that I take this my Friend Joseph Worth to be my Husband promising by the Lords Assistance to be unto him a True & Loving Wife until it shall please God by Death to separate us. And as a further Confirmation thereof the said Joseph Worth & Judith Worth did then and there to these Presents Set their hands She according to the custom of marriage assuming the Name of her Husband.

"This Meeting is Informed from the preparative Meeting that Joseph Worth Jr. doth request a few lines by way of Certificate to the monthly meeting of Friends at New Garden, where he is bound with his Family to Settle, and he appearing herein and offering a few Lines by way of Acknowledgment of his Shortness in heretofore removing to Nova Scotia without a Certificate, Friends think his Acknowledgement may be accepted & William Rotch & Christo Starbuck are appointed to Inspect the Circumstance of his removal & if it appears Clear to prepare a few

Lines as requested for him & Family & return to the monthly Meeting at a convenient time.

"2, 10 mo., 1774—Friends being met according to adjournment. The Friends heretofore appointed in Joseph Worth's case make return that nothing appears but that he is clear to remove hence to Settle at New Garden & also returned a few Lines prepared by way of Certificate to Friends there which were read, approved of & signed herein by the Clerk.

"At our monthly meeting of women Friends held on Nantucket ye 26th, 9 mo., 1774—Our Friend Judith Worth Requests a few lines by way of Certificate for herself and Two Daughters, Namely, Eunice & Metilda. Sarah Barney & Lois Macy are appointed to prepare the Same and bring to our next monthly meeting.

"At our monthly meeting of women Friends held on Nantucket ye 31st, 10 mo., 1774—The Friends appointed to write the Certificates for our Friend Judith Worth and her two Daughters have performed the same, which were Read, approved & Signed by the Clerk."

The Marriage Certificate of Matilda' (Worth) Folger of North Carolina

Whereas Latham Folger, son of Reuben Folger of Nantucket in New England and Dinah his deceased wife, and Matilda Worth daughter of Jos. Worth Junior, and Judith his wife, of Guilford county in the Province of North Carolina having declared their Intentions of marriage with Each other before Several Monthly Mtgs of the People called Quakers at Centre in the county of Guilford aforesaid, having consent of her parents and parties concerned they were allowed by Said Mtgs.

The Will of Jethro Starbuck Folger of Indiana

Jethro Starbuck' Folger (Matilda' Worth, Joseph', Lydia' Gorham, Shubael', Desire' Howland, John') was born at Centre, North Carolina, 80 October, 1797, removed to Rush County, Indiana, about 1836 and died there, 4 September, 1862 He married, first, Mary, daughter of Thomas and Sarah Barnard, and had:

The will of Jethro Starbuck' Folger was filed in the Clerk's Office of the Rush County Court of Common Pleas, 20 October, 1862 A literal copy of the will follows:

"Be it remembered that I Jethro S. Folger of the County of Rush and State of Indiana do hereby make ordain and publish this my last will and Testament (To wit)

It is my desire that all my just debts & reasonable funeral expenses be paid.

- It is my desire that my beloved wife Rebecca M. have all my household and Kitchen furniture in her own right together with one horse creature and two cows, also, that she have one hundred and fifty dollars annually out of the rents and profits of my Real Estate or the interest on my personal estate to rear and educate our minor children, and aid in their and her support generally, conditioned as follows, (to wit)—When my youngest child shall have arrived to the age of fifteen years or both of my infant sons shall have died or my widow shall have married then it is my desire that fifty dollars of said annuity be with held and pass into my estate generally or if either of my infant children shall die prior to the youngest arriving to the age of fifteen, then twentyfive dollars I desire to be with held as above directed, in case of both their deaths my widow retaining one hundred dollars in lieu of dower. Provided nevertheless that if my widow prefer to accept one third of the rents and profits of my real Estate together with one-third of the interest of my personal Estate, (in place of the annuity as above stipulated) during her natural life for the purposes as set forth above, then it is my desire that she have the right to choose for herself.
- 3⁴. If anything be left, out of the rents, profits, interest &c. of my Estate, after paying the annuities above stipulated, It is my desire that it be divided among my adult heirs annually.
- 4th. If my widow shall die prior to the majority of my infant heirs, in that case my desire is that her annuity go to their support and education, and if only one survive their mother, then one-half

of her annuity go for the support and education of the survivor, and the other half into the common stock to be distributed among the adult heirs as above directed.

5th. It is my desire that my infant sons John C. Fremont and Homer have as good an education as my adult heirs got (exclusive of their own means) And even further, if the means set apart for that purpose, will admit of it and they desire it.

6th. It is further my desire that my widow be furnished with a good comfortable house and out buildings so long as she remains such, And on the final settlement of my Estate that an equal distribution of the same be made among all my children.

7th. and lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my oldest son, Thomas Sydney and my esteemed nephew Franklin F. Swain my lawful Executors.

The Will of Isaac' Cushman of Vermont

The following interesting record is printed at the request of Festus Cushman" Lewis, California No. 61 (see page 100):

Isaac' Cushman (Charles, John, Eleaser, Mary Allerton, Isaac'), according to the Cushman Genealogy, appears to have removed from Plymouth to Rutland, Vermont, and to have had, by a wife whose name is not given, three daughters, Ethel, Lois and Polly. His will was dated 20 May, 1783, presented by the Executors in Court 9 June, 1783, and recorded 3 December, 1784, in Rutland, Vermont. It is important, as it proves that his wife's name was Lois, and that his oldest child was not a daughter, Ethel, as stated in the Genealogy, but a son, Ethiel, not of full age at the date of the will. The following is a literal copy:

"In the Name of God, Amen.

"I, Isaac Cushman, of Rutland, in the County of Rutland and State of Vermont, being thro the abundant goodness of God, tho weak in body yet of a Sound Mind and Memory, Do Constitute

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this my Last Will and Testament and desire it may be received by all as such. And

"First—I give and earnestly recommend my Soul to God who gave it in full confidence of its resurrection again to Glory at the last day. And my body I commend to the dust from whence it was taken to be decently buried after my decease at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named. And as to my worldly estate wherewith God hath been pleased to endow—

"I Positively Will and order that my Funeral and other just

debts be paid by my said Executors.

"Secondly—I give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife, Lois Cushman, one third part of my personal estate forever, and the use and improvement of one third part of my real estate during her natural Life, with one good Feather bed and furniture and the use and improvement of one third part of the dwelling house wherein I now live.

"Tertio-I give and bequeath unto my only son, Ethiel Cushman, the whole of my Homestead farm, whereon I now dwell, with the stock and farming utensils and other appurtenances thereunto belonging (except as before excepted), as also one half right or share of land thro the town of Rutland aforesaid which I hold by Deed from Gershom Beach, after deducting out so much as will pay all my just Debts and Charges (if any should be found to be needed after collecting such debts as are now due me). On condition that my said Son, Ethiel Cushman, shall do well and duly provide for my four Daughters, Mary Cushman, Lois Cushman, Sibbil Cushman and Levinah Cushman, suitable meat, Drink, Lodging & apparel fitting for their age and ages severally from time to time, both in sickness and in health, until they shall severally be married, or until they shall severally arrive at the age of eighteen years. And my said Son, Ethiel Cushman, shall do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto my said Daughters, Mary Cushman, Lois Cushman, Sibbil Cushman and Levinah Cushman, each of them Thirty pounds Lawful Silver money on their or either of their arrival to the age of eighteen years, and to each of my above named Daughters a further sum of Ten pounds like money on their or either of their arrival to the full age of nineteen years. Provided always, and it is herein provided, that if my said son should die before he arrives to the full age of Twenty-one years, or is married and have lawful issue of his Body, that then my sd Daughters shall Inherit as Coparceners.

Lastly—I do hereby Constitute and appoint my said wife, Lois Cushman, and Samuel Williams Sole Executors to this my



last Will and Testament, and do hereby amply and fully empower them, the sd. Lois and Samuel, or either of them, to sue for and recover of all and singular my Debtors such sum and sums as may be found on examination to be due to me in the name and by virtue of this my appointment of them as Executors, and on the reception of any such Debt or Debts to discharge any such person or persons, and if any overplus remains after paying my Just Debts and the expenses of Collecting to remit the same unto my said Son, Ethiel Cushman.

And I do hereby ratify and confirm this to be my last Will and Testament and earnestly request that it may be approved by the Court of Probate after my Decease and Registered in his Office as such.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal at Rutland aforesaid this 20th day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three.

Lydia Paddock (Susanna Gorham, Stephen, John, Desire Howland, John) born at Nantucket, Massachusetts, 18th day 4th month, 1782, was married at Nantucket, 7 February, 1750, to Shubael Bunker, at a Meeting of the Society of Friends. A copy of the marriage certificate follows (Book 1, page 191):

Whereas Shubael Bunker son of Zechariah Bunker of Sherborn on the Island of Nantucket in the Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England & Desire his Wife, And Lydia Paddock daughter of Daniel Paddock late of Sherborn aforesaid Deceased & Susanna his Wife: Having declared their Intentions of Taking each other in marriage before Several Publick Meetings of the People called Quakers in Sherborn aforesaid according to the good order used among them and proceeding therein after deliberate Consideration thereof (with regard unto the Righteous Law of God in that Case) They also appearing clear of all others & having Consent of Parents & others Concerned were allowed by the said meetings.

Now these are to certify to all whom it may concern that for the full accomplishing of their said Intentions this Seventh day of the Twelveth month called February in the year according to the Christian account One thousand Seven Hundred & Fifty they the said Shubael Bunker & Lydia Paddock Appeared in a Publick Assembly of the aforesaid People met Together at their Publick Meeting House in Sherborn aforesaid and in a solemn manner he the said Shubael Bunker taking the said Lydia Paddock by the hand did openly declare as followeth: Friends I Desire you to be my Witnesses that I take this my Friend Lydia Paddock to be my Wife Promising by the Lords Assistance to be unto her a true & Loving Husband until it shall please God by Death to separate us. And then & there in the said Assembly the said Lydia Paddock did in like manner declare as followeth: Friends, I desire you to be my Witnesses that I take this my Friend Shubael Bunker to be my Husband, promising by the Lords Assistance to be unto him a true & Loving Wife until it shall please God by Death to separate us And as a further confirmation thereof the said Shubael Bunker & Lydia Bunker did then & there to these Presents set their Hands She according to the custom of marriage assuming the Name of her Husband

The children of Shubael and Lydia (Paddock) Bunker, as recorded in Friends' Record of Births and Deaths, page 11, were as follows: Shubael, born 6th day, 2nd month, 1754; Puella, 7th, 5th, 1756; Francis, 81st, 7th, 1758; Gilbert, 17th, 11th, 1762; Naomi, 17th, 6th, 1766; Nathan, 8th, 11th, 1768; and Abiel (Abel), 29th, 9th, 1771

The following entry appears in volume 2, page 162, of the minutes of Nantucket Monthly Meeting of Friends, dated 27th day, 3rd month, 1780:

"A Removal Certificate to the monthly meeting of Friends at the Nine Partners in behalf of Shubael Bunker & his family was laid before this meeting by the Friends appointed in that service which was read approved of & signed herein by the Clerk."

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The youngest son, Abel, was taken by his parents to New York State; but it would appear that the oldest, Shubael, remained at Nantucket, as the record contains the following entry, under date of 26th day, 9th month, 1785:

"The Committee appointed to prepare a Certificate to Dartmouth monthly meeting in behalf of Shubael Bunker Junr produced one which, being read and approved, was signed by the elerk."

Isaac Harris, of Bridgewater, Mass., according to Mitchell's History of Bridgewater, married, first, Mercy Latham (Susanna Winslow, Mary Chilton, James), and had eight children, Arthur, Isaac, Samuel, Desire, Jane, Susanna, Mary and Mercy; and married, second, Mary, daughter of Robert Dunbar of Hingham, and had two children, Benjamin and Martha. Of these, the birth of one child is recorded: "The birth of Jane Harris being brought forth into The World the: 19; day of July; 1671; being when g (illegible) of years fit married to James dunbarr and After his decease the wife of Pelatiah Smith." (Mayflower Descendant, 2:243)

The following documents, relating to the settlement of the estate of Isaac Harris, who died before 19 June, 1708, are recorded in Plymouth:

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"September the 21. 1709. for the settlement of the Land of Isaac Harris Late of Bridgewater Deceased it is ordered by the Judge of Probate of Wills &c for the County of Plymouth as followeth (vix) That Isaac Harris son of ye said Deceased shall have the housing & the twenty acres of Land whereon the housing stands which wear apprized at 39-0-0 To him the sd Isaac &c his heirs forever he therefore paying the sd sum of thirty nine pounds money to the Administrators of the sd Isaac Harris his estate: And that Benjamin Harris younger son of the sd Isaac Harris shall have the piece of Land on the south side of the River & west side of the highway prized at Eight pounds & the 20 acres of Land near the Burch swamp by Waymouth Rhode prized at 5 pounds to him the said benjamin & his heirs for ever.

Arthur Harris (Isaac, Mercy Latham, Susanna Winslow, Mary Chilton, James) was born in Bridgewater, Massachusetts, 25 June, 1708; and died after 27 March, 1750, when his will was executed, and before 4 June, 1750, when it was allowed. He married first, 12 November, 1780 (Mayflower Descendant, 16:98) Mehitabel Rickard; and, second, about 1741, Bethiah Hayward. A literal copy of the will follows:

"In the Name of God Amen the twentiseveanth Day of March 1750 I Arthur Harris of Bridgwater in the County of Plimouth in his majesties province of the massachusets Bay in New England yeoman Being very Sick and Weake in Body But of perfect minde and memory thanks be given to God. Therefore Calling unto minde the mortality of my Body and Knowing that it is appoynted for all men once to Dye do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament that is to Say princeaply and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it and my Body I Recomend to the Earth to Be Buried in a Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors notthing Dougting But at ye General Resurrection I Shall Receive the Same again by the mighty power of God and as Touching Such Worly⁴. Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bles me in this Life I give Demise and dispose of the Same in the following manner and forme—

The Will of Bela Latham of Ohio

Bela Latham (Arthur, Nehemiah, Arthur, Chilton, Susanna Winslow, Mary Chilton, James) was born at Lyme, New Hampshire, 23 May, 1794, and died at Columbus, Ohio, 21 April, 1848. His will is recorded in the Probate Court, Franklin County, Ohio, in Will Record C, page 25. The records show (Adm. Doc., page 439) that on 18 May, 1848, Allen Latham and David W. Deshler were appointed executors of the last will and testament of Bela Latham, deceased. The bond fixed was \$30,000, with Wm. S.

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Sullivant and J. M. McKee as sureties. The will was proved 18 May, 1848, and the final account settled 18 December, 1865. The following is a literal copy of the will:

"In the name of the Benevolent Father of all, I, Bela Latham, of City of Columbus, in the State of Ohio, do make and publish this my last will and testament.

"Item. I give and devise to my beloved wife, Rosanna Latham, in lieu of her dower in Lot No. 647 in this City, also all the household furniture farming stock and utensils, together with the growing crop of the home place, my interest in the nursery, and Five Hundred Dollars in money.

Item. For the education and support of my four minor sons during their said minority, I give and devise to my son, James Latham, Twelve Hundred Dollars; to my son, Allen Latham, Fifteen Hundred Dollars; to my son, Frank B. Latham, the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars; to my son, Edward H. Latham, Fifteen Hundred Dollars.

Item. I do hereby authorise and empower my executors to this my last will to sell by private sale, or in such manner, upon such terms of credit or otherwise as they may think proper, all or any of my real estate and Deeds to purchasers to execute, acknowledge and deliver in Fee Simple; and I do further authorise said executors to sell all or any of my stage stock or other personal property not herein devised, and to compromise, adjust, release and discharge in such manner as they may deem proper, all debts and claims due me.

Item. It is my will that my just debts and all charges be first paid out of the proceeds of such sales or collections; (2d) That the money specially devised to my four minor children be paid to their guardian or guardians as often and in such sums as they may require.

"Item. It is my will that after making the said foregoing provisions the proceeds of all sales of land, stocks, etc., then remaining shall be divided by my executors into eight equal shares as often as may be convenient, and paid over one eight part to my wife, one eight part to my daughter, Mary C. McKee, and one eight part to each of my sons, William A. Latham, Milton S. Latham, James H. Latham, Allen Latham, Edward H. Latham, and Frank B. Latham; and should either of said children die

without issue prior to said distribution, it is my will that his or her legacy or distributive share shall be apportioned and distributed equally among my surviving children.

Item. I do hereby nominate and appoint my brother, Allen Latham, guardian of my sons, James H., Allen, Edward H., Frank B., until they severally arrive at the age of twenty-one years, the three last to remain with their mother until they are eight years old if convenient, or longer if their education can be properly attended to by so doing.

Item. I give and bequeath to my nephew, Arthur Latham, One Hundred Dollars as some return for his kindness and attention during my sickness in Cleveland.

Item. I do hereby nominate and appoint my brother, Allen Latham, and my friend, David W. Deshler, executors of this my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of April, A. D. 1848.

Thomas' Cushman, of Lebanon, Connecticut

One of the first results of the eareful work done in connection with the verification of lines submitted by applicants for membership in the Society of Mayflower Descendants (more particularly by the Massachusetts Society) has been the discovery of the names of additional children, when wills and other records have been compared with printed lists of the different families. Such omissions have occurred in earlier, as well as later generations. Many hundred cards have been sent out by this Society to persons residing in Pacific Coast States, whose names implied that they might be descended from Mayflower passengers; and one of these was responded to by Mr. James Thomas Cushman, of Seattle, Washington, who submitted a line of descent which could not be made to agree with the material printed in the Cushman Genealogy (1855). To his intelligent interest and perseverance must be attributed the discovery of an hitherto unknown grandson of John Howland, and great-grandson of Isaac Allerton. Under date of 15 September, 1916, Mr. Cushman wrote: "I am sure that the California Society may justly claim the credit of starting the search which ended successfully in the discovery of another son of Thomas and Ruth (Howland) Cushman. Until I received the card you sent me, I had never thought of running this matter

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down; but when once started, I determined to persevere until I should find that success was impossible. The final link was discovered through the efforts of a distant kinsman of mine, Mr. Theodore P. Adams, of Plymouth, Massachusetts, who kindly examined the land records." Mr. Cushman is a member of the Washington Society of Mayflower Descendants, and has, very kindly, furnished the California Society with copies of some of the records which have established his descent.

According to the Cushman Genealogy (page 100), Thomas Cushman (Mary' Allerton, Isaac') was "born 16 Sept., 1687, married 1st, Ruth Howland, daughter of John Howland, one of the old comers, 17 Nov., 1664 She was living when her father's Will was made, 29 May, 1672, and as he was married the second time in 1679, his first wife must have died between those dates. He married, 2nd, Abigail Fuller of Rehoboth, 16 Oct., 1679 He and his 2nd wife were members of the Church at Plympton." pages 124 and 125, the Genealogy states that Thomas' Cushman had one son, Robert Cushman, by his first wife, born 4 Oct., 1664; and, by his second wife, Job Cushman, born about 1680, Bartholomew Cushman, born 1684, Samuel Cushman, born 16 July, 1687, and Benjamin' Cushman, born 1691 As yet, we have learned of no claim that Thomas' Cushman had daughters; but, since his first wife lived for at least eight years after their marriage, it is not unlikely that the names of other children will be found in the records.

Thomas and Mary² (Allerton) Cushman had four sons, Thomas³, Isaac³, Elkanah³ and Eleazer³, all of whom were married; but, according to the Cushman Genealogy, none of these had a son Thomas Hence, as Elder Thomas Cushman died at Plymouth, 11 December, 1691, the following deed must have been executed by his son, Thomas³ Cushman (*Plymouth County Registry of Deeds*, Book 4, page 167):

"To all Christian People, to whom these Presents shall come, Thomas Cushman of the Towne of Plimouth, in the County of Plymouth in New England, sendeth Greeting, &c.

"Know yee that I the sd Thomas Cushman, for & in consideration of the full & inst sum of one hundred & seven Pounds & tenn shillings Currant Money of New England aforesaid To me in hand by Thomas Loring of Plimouth in ye County of Plimouth Aforesaid well & truly paid, with weh said sum I acknowledge myself to be fully contented satisfied & paid & thereof & of every

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part and parcel thereof doe clearly Acquitt Exonerate & Discharge the sd Thomas Loring his heirs Executrs administrs forever by these presents have given granted bargained sold aliened enfeofed & confirmed & by these presents for me & my heirs doe freely clearly and Absolutely give grant sell aliene enfeofe & confirme unto the sd Thomas Loring his heirs & Assigns forever all that my Lott of land lying & being in the Township of Duxboro Containing Twenty Acres more or less, viz: five Acres Adjoyning to the Lands of John Trasy, being the Spott upon which my son, Thomas Cushman, hath built, & is bounded as followeth, vis: toward the east by the lands of Elisha Wadsworth, towards the south alsoe by the Land of sd Wadsworth, towards the West by the high way or County Road, and towards the North by the Land of sd Trasy, extending Eastward from sd Road Thirty two Rods in length and extending Southward from sd Trasys land for its bredth twenty five Rods to a way sett out by sd Wadsworth for his own use. Also fiveteen Acres more (be it more or less) lying upon Jones River & bounded as followeth vis. bounded on the east by land of sd Elisha Wadsworth by an heap of Stones at the northeast Corner and Another heap of Stones at ye Southeast Corner being twenty Rods in breadth bounded on ye North by the lands of Elisha Bradford on the west by the Meadow of Thomas Cushman of Duxboro & on the South by sd Jones's River and the Land of sd Wadsworth. Together with all my Right title or interest in or unto the sd granted & bargained premises with all & singular the Rights priviledges and Appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise Appertaining. To have & to hold the sd five Acres & the sd fiveteen Acres of Land within the Limitts above expressed with all the housing fences fencing wood timber and all whatsoever Upon sd Lands as alsoe all my Right title or Interest in or unto any Common or Undevided lands in the township of Duxboro aforesd.

"Unto him the sd Thomas Loringe his heirs & Assigns forever unto his & theire only Proper use & behoof forever. And I the sd Thomas Cushman for myself my heirs Executrs & Administratrs to & with the sd Thomas Loring his heirs & Assignes Doe Covenant & Promis in manner & forme following, vist. that att the time of Ensealing & till the perfecting hereof I am the proper & Lawfull owner of sd bargained premises And that I have good Rightfull Power & lawfull Authority to sell assure & Confirme the same in manner & forme as above expressed, and that the sd bargained Premises are free & Clear & clearly Acquitted of & from all other & former gifts grants bargains sales titles troubles &

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Incumbrances what soever by me hertofr had made done or suferd to be done or by any other person or persons whatsoever by or with my Consent allowance cause means privity or procurement. And I doe hereby Warrant to maintaine the Sale abovesd. & the sd Thomas Loring his heirs & Assignes in his & their Peacable enjoyment of the Premises for ever to defend against my self my heirs & assignes &c. every other Person & Persons Lawfully claiming any Right title or Interest in or unto the same or any part or parcell therof.

"In Wittness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seall this third day of February Anno Domini One Thousand Seven hundred and two

The above record establishes the fact that "Thomas Cushman of Duxboro" was the son of Thomas Cushman of Plymouth, and that the latter's second wife, Abigail (Fuller) Cushman, gave her assent to the transaction. On the day following the signing of the above deed, Thomas Cushman, Jr., joined in another, abridged as below:

". . . Thomas Loring of Plymouth in the County of Plymouth in New England & Thomas Cushman of Duxborough in the County aforesd . . . for and in consideration of the full & just summ of Twenty Pounds Currant money of New England aforesd to us in hand by Majr John Bradford of Plymouth aforesd . . . unto him the sd John Bradford his Heirs & assigns forever All that our two acres of meadow or marsh (more or less) situate lying & being within the Township of Duxborough aforesd a little above the bridge called Jones River Bridge together with

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a strip of upland thereto adjoyning which upland and meadow is bounded as followeth; Towards the Southwest by the River Towards the Northwest by a Creek that runs between sd marsh & the marsh of Majr William Bradford Towards the Northeast by the marsh lately in the Tenure of Captn Joseph Howland & toward the Southeast by the County Road. . . . In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals this fourth Day of February anno Domini one thousand seven hundred & two 1702/8

"Signed sealed & delivered in presence of us

"Thomas Clarke "Ephraim Little

"Memon That before sealing & delivereing it was agreed & concluded as followeth vis. that the abovesd Thomas Cushman sells assures & ingages to defend the two acres of meadow and Thomas Loring sells assures & ingages to defend only the strip of upland adjoyning & is in no way concerned in ye meadow.

"Witness—Eph^m Litte Junr. Thomas Cushman (Seal)

"Entred September 9th 1713 and Recorded pr Josiah Cotton Regr. Mem. That on the fifth day of February 1702/3 Then the above-named Thomas Loring & Thomas Cushman both of them personally appeared before me the subscriber one of her Majesties Justices of the Peace for the County of Plymouth & acknowledged the above written instrument to be their Act & Deed. At the same time Sarah the wife of the above named Thomas Cushman also appeared & gave up her Right in the Premises.

As early as 1703, Thomas Cushman, of Duxbury, Mass., became interested in lands at Lebanon, Connecticut, as appears by Lebanon Land Records. In Vol. 1, page 139 (new page 281) is recorded a deed from "Henry Woodward of Lebanon to Thomas Coachman of Duxberry in the County of Plimouth in the Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England . . . all my whole right of alotment in the township of Lebanon, in that part of the township called Lebanon Village, containing 200 acres, to ly in Common according to the costom of the place . . . the first of April, 1703" The witnesses to this deed were Thomas Thacher and John Strong. Other deeds are of record from "John Smith of Lebanon to Thomas Coushman of Lebanon" for 51 acres, dated 19 July, 1710, and from "Moses Woodworth and David Wood-

worth, both of Norwich, in the County of New London & Colony of Connecticut in New England . . . to Thomas Coushman of Lebanon" for about 92 acres, dated 20 November, 1724.

On tombstones in the Old Cemetery at Lebanon, Conn., may be seen the following inscriptions:

"Here lies the body of Mr. Thomas Cushman, late husband of Mrs. Sarah Cushman, who died January 9, 1727 aged 57 years

Here lies our honored Father dear Who was our faithful guide. Here also lies our Mother dear Intombed by his side 1728

"Here lies the body of Mrs. Sarah Cushman, late wife of Mr. Thomas Cushman, who died Dec. 25, 1726, aged 52 years

Here lies yo womb with in this tomb From whence we had our nature We hope they both are now at rest In God their great Creator."

This Society has procured a certified copy of the will of Thomas Cushman of Lebanon (Windham Probate Records, Vol. 1, pages 167-170), which is given in full hereunder:

"In the name of God Amen.

The ninth day of January In ye year 1726/7 I, Thomas Cushman of Lebanon In yo County of Windham and Colony of Connecticut in New England being very sick and weake in Body but of perfict Mind and Memory Thanks be Given to God therefor. Caling to mind yo mortality of my body and knowing It is appointed For all men once to Dye, Do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament. That is to say principally and first of all I Give and Recommend my Soull Into yo hands of God that gave it and my Body I Recomend to yo Earth to Buried in decent Christian Buriall at vo Discretion of my Executors hereafter named Nothing Doubting but at yo General Resurrection I shall Receive yo same by yo mighty power of God. And as touching my Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bles me in this life I Give Devise and Dispose of ye same in yo following manner and form—First that all my lawful Debts be truly paid out of my moveable Estate in Creatures as Stock.

Imprimis I Give and Bequeath to my Son William Cushman all my lott of land that I bought of Moses Woodworth and David Woodworth lying on yo Southeast side of yo Street against or near to my New Dwelling hous as it is discribed to be bounded in my Deed from sd Woodworths, to be to him my Son William, his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Cushman my new Dwelling hous and all y° lott of land as it is bounded by my Deed from Henry Woodworth with all y° buildings orchardings fencing and all y° Priviledges thare on or thare unto belonging together with a Division of land at y° Reer ajoyning to y° abovesd lot As may appear of Record in Lebanon book of Records Reserving to my Son William Cushman y° priviledg and benefit and use of one half of y° hous and barn that stands on this lott for y° space of Ten years, this lott with y° Division with all y° Priviledges thare on or thare unto belonging, one half of y° Hous and Barn only Reserved for ten years, to be to him my son Thomas Cushman his heirs and assigns for ever.

Said In Door Moveables to be Divided to my three Daughters and what is wanting to be payd in Mony or Creturs at a Reasonable price to be paid by my Executors.

Itim. I Give and bequeath to my daughter Ruth Cushman yesume of fifty Pounds of my moveable Estate within Doors Equall with her Sisters at Inventory price yes Rest if anything be wanting to be paid in mony or Creturs at a Reasonable price to be payd to her by my Executors when she shall Come to be at yes age Eighteen years.

Itim. I Give and bequeath to my Daughter lidish Cushman ye Sume of fifty pounds of my moveable Estate within Doars, the In

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Doar things to be divided to my three Daughters at Inventory price and what is wanting to be payd in mony or creturs at a Reasonable price to be payd to hur by my Executors When she shall atain to y^o age of Eighteen years.

And it is allso my Will that if my son Eleazer should Dye before he Comes to be of yo age of twenty and one years then what I have Given to him shall be equally divided between my other two sons William and Thomas.

And also in Case that if Either of my Daughters should Dye before they Come to be at you age of Eighteen years, Then that which I have given to hur Shall be Equally Divided between your Surviving Daughters.

And Further I do order that when all my lawful Debts and y° above legasis to my three Daughters are paid that if there should be any overplush of my moveable Estate, It shall be Equally Divided amongst my three Sons; and in Case there be not moveable Estate Sufficient to pay my Debts and s⁴ legasies That then what is wanting shall be paid in Equal proportion Between my s⁴ three Sons. And I do make and ordain my two sons William and Thomas my Sole Executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hearby utterly Disalow Revoake & Disanull all and every other Testaments wills and legasies and bequests and Executors by me before Name Willed and bequeathed, Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.

Received of Preserved Strong Executor of last will of his father Jedediah Strong, late of Coventry dec^d—y° sum of 9 shil & nine pence in full of what was will'd to me by my honored Grandfather Jedediah Strong afores^d. I say rec^d by me.

Thomas' Cushman (Thomas', Thomas', Mary' Allerton, Isaac'), born before 1706, married about 1728-9, Mary, and had children (Town and First Church records, Lebanon, Conn.):

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Sybil Cushman, born 7 April 1732, baptized 23 April, 1732 Rhoda Cushman, born 4 February, 1738-4, baptized 24 March, 1734

Solomon Cushman, baptized with Rhoda, 24 March, 1784 Mercy Cushman, born 23 October, 1784, baptized 6 January, 1786

Mary Cushman, born 16 May, 1787, baptized 19 June, 1787 Thomas Cushman, born 19 December, 1789, baptized 9 March, 1740

The First Church records give the baptism, also, of Mary Cushman, 1 March, 1780, Sarah Cushman, 8 April, 1788 and Lydia Cushman, 18 January, 1786, whose parentage we have not ascertained. It is hoped that the Connecticut Society may find it practicable to undertake research work in towns settled in early years by Pilgrim families, to the end that the record of the Cushman and other lines may be made more nearly complete.

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
